The role of the 24/7 ICTG Support Line: We offer a 24/7 support line for all ICTA early adopter sites; providing consultation, advice & guidance to professionals who have trafficking including guidance on immediate safety planning. Referrals for young people eligible for direct work will be allocated to an ICTG who will make contact with the young person whitin 24 hours to offer support; they will offer specialist trafficking support for professionals involved with the young person's care. Referrals for young people eligible for indirect work will be allocated to the ICTG RPC who will offer specialist trafficking and exploitation support for professionals involved in the

The process accepts referrals from West Midlands Police and any of the 7 local authorities. A SASCC is convened with the consent of an adult survivor, and looks to arrange a multi-agency safeguarding discussion and associated agency actions within 24 to 48 hrs of their identification/recovery. The process aims to deliver a survivor led response in a manner that provides the best opportunity for recovery and potential engagement with law enforcement if the survivor is supportive. The process commenced in March 2021 and, to date, 16 adult cases have been discussed, with numerous others advised upon. The Chair and lead is employed by the WMASN and is a retired detective superintendent (ex-W.Mids Slavery/Trafficking Lead).
